Recently, vice-president Brad Kiendl, executive director Colleen Clark, community director for North Langley Frank Bucholtz, past president Scott Johnston, and myself had the pleasure of attending the BC Chamber annual general meeting (AGM) in Burnaby where we introduced six

policy resolutions at the AGM policy sessions: • Enabling a

sustainable rental housing market; • Maximizing taxpayer dollars on public infrastruc-

ture projects and defending the rights of B.C. companies and workers; • Protection of industrial

Industrial lands for future prosperity;
Supporting B.C.'s land-based wineries, cideries, and

distilleries; • The need for an innovative approach to transportation

for an increasingly urban province; and

• Credit card merchant fees. We are very proud to say that all six have passed and they are now available on our website for more details.

This process is one step in initiating change for business. With the support of the BC

Chamber network, we can now lobby the provincial and federal government on these, and 67 other issues, to assist in reducing red tape and making it easier for business to succeed.

Also during the week at the conference and AGM, our past president from 2013-2015, Kristine Simpson, was inducted as the chair of the board for the BC Chamber of Commerce. We at the Greater Langley Chamber of Commerce look forward to working with her and her board

on provincial issues over the next year.

Our former executive director, Lynn Whitehouse, was presented a BC Chamber of Commerce Fellow.
